Jesus Sweats Blood and Heals a Severed Ear

Key Point: We do God's will.

Bible Verse: Luke 22:39-51

Luke 22:39-51 International Children's Bible (ICB)

Jesus Prays Alone

³⁹⁻⁴⁰ Jesus left the city and went to the Mount of Olives. His followers went with him. (Jesus went there often.) He said to his followers, "Pray for strength against temptation."

⁴¹Then Jesus went about a stone's throw away from them. He kneeled down and prayed, ⁴²"Father, if it is what you want, then let me not have this cup^[3] of suffering. But do what you want, not what I want." ⁴³Then an angel from heaven appeared to him to help him. ⁴⁴Jesus was full of pain; he prayed even more. Sweat dripped from his face as if he were bleeding. ⁴⁵When he finished praying, he went to his followers. They were asleep. (Their sadness had made them very tired.) ⁴⁶Jesus said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray for strength against temptation."

Jesus Is Arrested

 47 While Jesus was speaking, a crowd came up. One of the 12 apostles was leading them. He was Judas. He came close to Jesus so that he could kiss him.

*But Jesus said to him, "Judas, are you using the kiss to give the Son of Man to his enemies?"

⁴⁹The followers of Jesus were standing there too. They saw what was happening. They said to Jesus, "Lord, should we use our swords?" ⁵⁰And one of them did use his sword. He cut off the right ear of the servant of the high priest.

⁵¹ Jesus said, "Stop!" Then he touched the servant's ear and healed him.

a. 22:42 **cup** Jesus is talking about the bad things that will happen to him. Accepting these things will be hard, like drinking a cup of something that tastes very bitter.

Play with these ideas:

Materials needed: Paper, crayons or colored pencils or markers, tape

Grab a piece of paper and make a decorated heart on it with crayons, markers, or colored pencils. Take your time and make it a nice picture. Give it to a grownup. The grown up will tear the nice picture in half. Does that seem kind of shocking? With that in mind, what are some possible reasons Jesus didn't want Peter to cut off the slave's ear? You made something nice and someone harmed it. God made the slave that the disciple harmed. The slave being harmed must not have been God's will. We can guess that because Jesus immediately healed the man's ear. With some tape, put your picture back together as a symbol of how Jesus fixed the man's ear in a miraculous way.
