August 13th– Dear Exiles,- Jeremiah 29– When those in exile wonder how long they should plan on staying in Babylon, Jeremiah writes them a letter and basically says, “Bloom where you're planted!” This sermon seeks to answer the question, “Can happiness be found away from home?”

August 20th– The Way of Life and Death– Jeremiah 21– For those that choose to surrender to the Babylonians, God promises life and blessing in exile. For those that stand their ground in Jerusalem...not so much.

August 27th– A Tale of Two Provinces– Jeremiah 39-42– Back in Jerusalem, everything is falling apart. Yet those in exile in Babylon are in relative peace. We cannot control the decisions of others. We must choose to obey God and hope that our influence can point them the way to Jesus.
